Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated was founded on January 16, 1920, at Howard University, Washington, D.C., by five undergraduate women who wanted sororities to be more than social organizations, instead to directly affect positive change on the pressing issues of the day and to raise people's consciousness. Arizona Cleaver Stemons, Pearl Anna Neal, Myrtle Tyler Faithful, Viola Tyler Goings and Fannie Pettie Watts believed that sorority elitism and socializing were overshadowing the real mission of progressive organizations and failed to address fully the societal mores, ills, prejudices and poverty affecting humanity in general and the Black community in particular.

These women, also known as our Five Pearls, zeroed in on four areas: Scholarship, Service, Sisterly Love and Finer Womanhood. What they started has blossomed into an international non-profit 501(c) (7) organization of more than 125,000 members and 875-plus chapters spread across the United States, Africa, Europe, Asia and the Caribbean, and divided into eight regions.

The Sorority has been innovative because it has chronicled several firsts:

- ✓ The first Greek-letter sorority organized in Africa
- ✓ The first to establish a national executive office of a Black sorority, in 1948
- ✓ The first to establish national auxiliaries
- ✓ The first and only National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) sorority to be constitutionally connected with a fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated

There had briefly been a Zeta graduate chapter in the community before us, but many of Lambda Psi Zeta's members moved away over time. Those sorors still around continued to informally get together, found they liked meeting up and decided to bring a new graduate chapter to the area.

Thus, Rho Theta Zeta was born, birthed by 10 women made up of Zetas already living the community and some who had recently graduated from Western Michigan University. The charter members are Sorors Keisha Barksdale, Ondraya Dixon, Renita Ellis, Bridgett Gibson, Joan Harris, Kelley Kellis, Monique Ligons, Peggy McKnight, Sheila Parkman and Hillary Williams.

In 2017, we were named Michigan Chapter of the Year at the Michigan State Organization Leadership Conference. We have twice co-hosted the state conference. Fields is active with a long and diverse list of organizations, such as the Executive Board of Centrica Care Navigators (formerly Hospice Care of Southwest Michigan), Cradle Kalamazoo Steering Committee, Group Violence Intervention Executive Committee, Kalamazoo Junior Girls, Douglass Community Association, the Kalamazoo Public Safety Department's new recruits' diversity/cultural training program, Mothers of Hope and S.H.A.R.E., to name just a few of the groups making a difference with which she is involved.

Fields worked for Kalamazoo County government in the Head Start Program and the Maternal and Infant Health programs before retiring in 2014 after 39 years. While with the county, she advocated along with co-workers to unionize the Kalamazoo County Head Start. She was also instrumental in the development of the county's Anti-Racism Team. Her service on it resulted in increased hiring of people of color within the Health and Community Services Department. During COVID, Guess and business partners Symphony Ollie and Bryan Sims formed a successful AirBnB business, and, in April 2022, opened the first Black-owned entertainment venue on the Downtown Kalamazoo Mall, The Xperience by Luxury Escapes, Inc.

The Xperience by LuXury Escapes, Inc., is a multi-use event venue. Within the first eight months of business, The Xperience was able to generate over six figures in revenue through a unique business model that focuses on collaboration with other Black and Brown-owned small businesses. Within this business model, The Xperience has paid over \$100K of revenue for the participating vendors, and the model has been used by other new venues opening around the city.

Coming from the Northside of Kalamazoo, Guess hopes that all her business and non-profit endeavors will inspire her community to strive for more, and be an example that there are no limits to what you can do.

Black Wall Street Kalamazoo is focused on the African-American community within Kalamazoo County to boost generational wealth building. BWSK is the area's Black Business Directory, highlighting and lifting up the African-American entrepreneur. The guiding principles of BWSK are to access and aid in advocating for equal lending and banking practices, the primary to ownership and generational wealth. Business education, acumen, economics and collaboration are consistently fostered in its endeavors.
